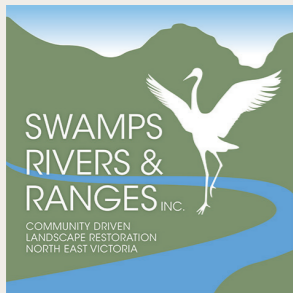


NATIVE FLOWERING CALENDAR



Fill your garden with flowering native plants and provide food for birds and insects all year round. Flowering times may differ based on climate and seasonal variability. The suitability of plants for different areas in the region may be impacted by the severity of frosts and rainfall. Consider the structure of plants as some can be sharp or spikey and not always suitable for gardens accessed by children. Native plant species are typically available at your local native plant nursery where you can get additional advice on these species as well as other species and flowering times in your local area. Whilst this calendar only includes Australian native species, exotics such as Salvias can also be a great food source, if managed in the right way. Please be aware that some exotic species can become weedy pests if they escape from your garden.

JANUARY

- Lightwood** - *Acacia implexa* (December - February) ● T
- Tall Sedge** - *Carex appressa* (October - Feb) ● G
- Illawarra Flame Tree** - *Brachychiton acerifolius* (November - March) ●● T

FEBRUARY

- Black Anther Flax Lily** - *Dianella revoluta* (August - February) ● G
- Sticky Everlasting** - *Xerochrysum viscosum* (October - May) ● C
- Blue Devil** - *Eryngium ovinum* (December - March) ●● C

MARCH

- Wallaby Grass** - *Rytidosperma caespitosum* (November - March) G
- Creeping Boobiella** - *Myoporum parvifolium* (October - May) ●● C
- Sweet Bursaria** - *Bursaria spinosa* (October - March) ●● S

APRIL

- White Correa** - *Correa alba* (March - October) ●● S
- Pincushion Hakea** - *Hakea laurina* (April - June) ●● S
- Bidgee Widgee** - *Acaena novae-zelandiae* (September - April) ●● C

MAY

- Emu Bush** - *Eremophila glabra or maculate* (April - November) ●● S
- Flowering Gum** - *Eucalyptus leucoxylon 'Rosea'* (April - October) ●● T
- Native Fuchsia** - *Correa reflexa* (March - December) ●● C

JUNE

- Wax Flower** - *Crowea exalata* (February - July) ●● S
- Old Man Banksia** - *Banksia serrata* (December - August) ●● S T
- Grevillea Jephcottii** (April - November) ●● S

JULY

- Ned Kelly or Superb Grevillea** - *Grevillea alpina* (July- May) ●● S
- Woolly Grevillea** - *Grevillea lanigera* (July- November) ●● S
- Ovens Wattle** - *Acacia pravissima* (July - October) ●● S T

AUGUST

- Grass Tree** - *Xanthorrhoea australis* (July - December) ●● T
- Sticky Hop Bush** - *Dodonaea viscosa* (August - October) ●● S
- Fringed Heath Myrtle** - *Micomyrthus ciliata* (August - November) ●● S

SEPTEMBER

- Purple Coral Pea** - *Hardenbergia violacea* (August - November) ●● C
- Golden Wattle** - *Acacia pycnantha* (August - November) ●● T
- Long-leaf Waxflower** - *Philothea myoporoides* (September - March) ●● S
- Bent Leaf Wattle** - *Acacia flexifolia* (June - October) ●● S

OCTOBER

- Common Eutaxia** - *Eutaxia microphylla* (August - November) ●● S
- Weeping Bottlebrush** - *Callistemon viminalis* (September - December) ●● S
- Tree Violet** - *Melicytus dentatus* (August - October) ●● S
- Chocolate Lily** - *Arthropodium strictum* (August - December) ●● C

NOVEMBER

- Tussock Grasses** - *Poa sieberiana or Poa labillardierei* (October-February) G
- Common Everlasting** - *Chrysocephalum apiculatum* (September- February) ●● C
- Spiny-headed May Rush** - *Lomandra longifolia* (August - December) ●● G
- Creeping Myoporum** - *Myoporum parvifolium* (October - March) ●● C

DECEMBER

- Kangaroo Grass** - *Themeda triandra* (July - December) G
- River Bottle Brush** - *Callistemon sieberi* (November - March) ●● S
- Hairy Bursaria** - *Bursaria lasiophylla* (December - February) ●● S
- Native Bindweed** - *Convolvulus angustissimus* (September - January) ●● C
